ACCLIMATION LETTER



Your pet's health & safety are our top priority.

For your pet's safety and in accordance with U.S. government laws and regulations, an acclimation letter signed by a USDA accredited veterinarian is required when the outside temperature is forecasted to be between 20 and 45 F (-6.6 and 7.2 C) at any time while your pet is in our care. Please provide this letter to your veterinarian and keep in mind it has to be completed within 10 days of travel.

What is Delta Cargo's temperature policy?

- Government regulations indicate a safe temperature range for most pets is 45°F to 85°. If the temperatures are between 20 and 45°F (-6.6 and 7.2°C), pets can only travel via Cargo if an acclimation letter is obtained and signed by a licensed and USDA accredited veterinarian.
- For your pet's safety and wellbeing, Delta Cargo will only transport your pet(s) if the temperature is forecasted to be between 20°F (-6.6 °C) and 80°F (26.6°C) during the entire time in which your pet will be in our care. This includes time of acceptance to flight departure, on the ground during transfer (if applicable), and two hours (domestic) or four hours (international) after flight arrival at destination.
- Delta Cargo reserves the right to deny the transport of your pet if the required temperature window listed above (in red)
 cannot be met, an acclimation letter is not provided when the forecasted temperature is below 45°F, or an acclimation letter
 is not completed within 10 days of travel.
